SUBJECT: Long Term Service Agreement for the San Juan generation Unit Confidentiality Request.

RESOLUTION

On October 20, 2016, the Puerto Rico Energy Commission ("Commission") held a Clarification Call to address certain issues on the present case. During the call the Commission requested the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") certain documents and information, which it then formally requested through a letter sent on October 21, 2016. Specifically, the Commission requested PREPA to provide unredacted copies of currently-active maintenance contracts for San Juan (Hitachi-Mitsubishi) and Cambalache (GE) generation units.

On October 26, 2016, PREPA filed an unredacted version of the Cambalache (GE) contract and a redacted copy of a Long Term Service Agreement between PREPA and MHPS Puerto Rico, LLC ("PREPA-MHPS Agreement")¹ for the San Juan generation unit. The filing included a letter from MHPS Puerto Rico, LLC ("MHPS") highlighting the confidential nature of certain information contained in the PREPA-MHPS Agreement. For this reason, MHPS requested the Commission to adhere to certain terms and conditions regarding treatment of confidential information contained in said Agreement.² On November 4, 2016 the Commission issued an Order in which it determined that PREPA did not comply with the Commission's requirement to produce an unredacted copy of the PREPA-MHPS Agreement and ordered PREPA to file an unredacted version by November 7, 2016 along with any corresponding confidentiality claim pursuant to the Commission's confidentiality procedures.

On November 10, 2016 PREPA filed an unredacted copy of the PREPA-MHPS Agreement along with a motion requesting confidentiality treatment. In support of its request for confidentiality, PREPA argued that the document contains trade secrets. Act 80-2011³ requires PREPA to demonstrate that the information it deems a trade secret has a real or potential independent economic value, or that the information provides a competitive advantage since such information is no readily accessible to the public.

In its motion, PREPA argued that the information contained in the PREPA-MHPS Agreement is proprietary and confidential property of MHPS or its affiliate, is not known to the general public, is deemed by MHPS to be commercially sensitive, and is protected trade secret under Act 80-2011.⁴ PREPA argued that disclosure of the information contained in the PREPA-MHPS Agreement could cause a significant and irreversible impairment of MHPS's ability to compete, as the information is related to its pricing, insurance coverages, and risk acceptance. PREPA adds that the information in the agreement is also *de facto* information of PREPA, in the sense that the protection of such confidential information directly impacts its business relationship with MHPS. PREPA also argued that the release of the information has an independent economic value to MHPS and PREPA, and could be used by a competitor to reduce or eliminate the competitive advantage of both entities, resulting in the loss of business for both PREPA and MHPS. PREPA stressed the importance of maintaining the trust and confidence of a business partner, as recognized by Act 80-2011, were if PREPA were to compromise its relationship with its business partners, it could potentially lose important business and hence its ability to operate.

Finally, PREPA requests that due to the nature of the information contained in the PREPA-MHPS Agreement, which is considered highly confidential information of MHPS, a non-regulated entity with whom PREPA continues to negotiate, such information should only be available to the Commission and not to intervenors, even if they have executed a non-disclosure agreement.

After reviewing PREPA's arguments in support of its request, the Commission **GRANTS** PREPA's request for confidentiality. The Commission also **GRANTS** PREPA's request not to disclose the unredacted version of the Agreement to any intervenor.

For the benefit of all the parties involved, the Commission issues this Resolution in both Spanish and English languages. Should any conflict between each version arise, the English version shall prevail.
