SUBJECT: Non Profit Intervenors Request for
Intervention as *Amicus Curiae*.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On July 30, 2019, Centro Unido de Detallistas (“CUD”), Cámara de Mercadeo, Industria y Distribución de Alimentos (“MIDA”), Puerto Rico Manufacturers Association (“PRMA”), Cooperativa de Seguros Múltiples de Puerto Rico (“CSMPR”), Unidos Por Utuado (“UPA”) and the Instituto de Competitividad y Sostenibilidad Económica de Puerto Rico (“ICSE-PR”), jointly denominated “Non Profit Intervenors”, filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board (“Energy Bureau”) a document titled *Request for Intervention as Amicus Curiae* (“Request”).

Through its Request, the Non Profit Intervenors state that they “represent the small and retail business sector, the industrial sector, cooperatives, communities and non-profits, comprising most of the economic sectors in the Island.”¹ Furthermore, they argue that the parties have an interest and proven capacity for discussion of facts and recommendations regarding the Integrated Resource Plan (“IRP”) review process.


Upon review of the Request, the Energy Bureau found several contradictions as to the Non Profit Intervenors’ Request. Specifically, certain parts of the Request refer to participation in the instant case as *Amicus Curiae*, while others request to be accepted in the proceeding as intervenors. Therefore, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** the Non Profit Intervenors until **12:00 p.m. on August 2, 2019**, to (i) clarify its intent of participation in the instant case; (ii) modify its Request accordingly; and (iii) comply with the provisions of Sections 5.05 and 7.01 of Regulation 8543.²




