RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On December 24, 2019, Windmar filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") a document titled *Windmar's Motion to Request a Clarification and File Surrebuttal Testimony of Víctor González in Refutation of the Rebuttal Testimony of Nelson Bacalao* ("Motion"). Through its Motion, Windmar (i) requested a clarification in relation to Dr. Bacalao's Rebuttal Testimony, filed on December 20, 2019; and (ii) submitted written surrebuttal testimony of Víctor González in refutation of Dr. Bacalao's Rebuttal Testimony.

I. Request for Clarification

With respect to the request for clarification, Windmar stated that the answers provided by Dr. Bacalao, beginning on page 16 of 22 of its rebuttal testimony, appear to be incomplete. Furthermore, Windmar argued that lines 295 onward, particularly line 302, are difficult to understand.

Upon review of Windmar's request, the Energy Bureau **ORDERS** the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") to, **within five (5) days** of the notification of this Resolution and Order, express its position with regards to Windmar's request for clarification.

II. Surrebuttal Testimony of Víctor González

As part of its Motion, Windmar submitted a surrebuttal testimony of its witness, Víctor González, in refutation of Dr. Bacalao's rebuttal testimony.


On December 26, 2019, PREPA filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Motion to Strike Written Testimonies* ("Motion to Strike"). In its Motion to Strike, PREPA stated that the deadlines for intervenors to submit supplemental written testimonies was December 11, 2019. Furthermore, PREPA argues that the procedural calendar does not

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
allow for the filing of surrebuttal testimonies and therefore, Mr. González' surrebuttal testimony should be stricken from the record.


Due to procedural economy, the filing of surrebuttal testimony is not part of the procedural calendar of the instant case, as approved by the Energy Bureau. Therefore, the Energy Bureau **DETERMINES** that the surrebuttal testimony filed as part of Windmar's Motion is **stricken from the record**. However, this does not preclude Windmar to question PREPA's witnesses regarding the arguments contained in its surrebuttal testimony during their cross examination at the Evidentiary Hearing in the instant case.
