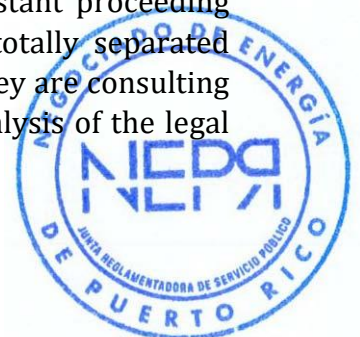
**I. Introduction**

On February 25, 2021, LUMA ENERGY, LLC as ManagementCo, and LUMA ENERGY SERVCO, LLC as ServCo (collectively, "LUMA") filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") a document titled *LUMA's Submittal and Request for Approval of System Operation Principles* ("SOP Petition") in compliance with Section 6.22 of Act 57-2014.

On April 27, 2021, the Energy Bureau issued Resolution and Order ("April 27 Resolution") determining that the SOP Petition was complete and established a procedural calendar for the instant case. Through the procedural calendar, the Energy Bureau scheduled public hearings to be celebrated May 21 and 24, 2021. The Energy Bureau established May 26, 2021, as the deadline for the general public to file comments regarding the SOP Petition.

On May 25, 2021, the Puerto Rico Institute of Competitiveness and Economic Sustainability ("ICSE") filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Comments to LUMA's System Operation Principles* ("May 25 Comments"). Through the May 25 Comments, ICSE proposed for LUMA to add two principles to the SOP: (i) Empowering Prosumers, and (ii) Integrated Distributed Energy Resources.

On the same day, ICSE filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Motion Requesting Extension of Time to File Comments* ("May 25 Request"), in which ICSE states that they acknowledge the integrated nature of the planning, the budgeting, the metrics of immediate remediation and long-term grid re-building and modernization progress inherent to various intertwined proceedings. ICSE sustains that the instant proceeding requires a holistic analysis, more complex and time consuming than totally separated proceedings and that to be able to responsible comment of this matter, they are consulting with experts based in the United States, in order to make a judicious analysis of the legal



implications of these issues. Therefore, ICSE requests an additional term of fourteen (14) days to file their position on these issues.

The Energy Bureau takes notice that the May 25 Comments were timely filed. The Energy Bureau **DETERMINES** that the May 25 Request is untimely since ICSE was provided ample time to review the public documents, prepare and timely file its comments. ICSE also had the opportunity to participate in the public hearings to submit its comments directly to the Energy Bureau, although it failed to do so. Therefore, the Energy Bureau **DENIES** the May 25 Request.


