**SUBJECT: Submission of List of Projects and
Scopes of Work.**

**MOTION SUBMITTING LIST OF PROJECTS AND TWENTY-EIGHT SCOPES
OF WORK**

TO THE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:

COME NOW LUMA Energy, LLC (“ManagementCo”)¹, and **LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC** (“ServCo”)², (jointly referred to as “LUMA”), through the undersigned legal counsel and respectfully submit the following:

1. On April 14, 2021, the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority (“PREPA”) filed with this honorable Puerto Rico Energy Bureau (“Energy Bureau”) a list of projects that would be submitted for approval by Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”) and the Puerto Rico Central Office for Recovery, Reconstruction and Resiliency (“COR-3”).

2. Thereafter, PREPA filed with this Energy Bureau the project files that had been submitted to FEMA and COR-3. *See* Motion in Compliance with Resolution and Order issued on April 22, 2021, filed by PREPA on April 28, 2021 and May 4, 2021.

3. On June 8, 2021, this Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order whereby it approved sixty-five (65) projects that PREPA had submitted for consideration in connection with

the Revised 10-Year Infrastructure Plan (“June 8th Approval Resolution and Order”). At page 3 of the June 8th Approval Resolution and Order, the Energy Bureau directed LUMA to provide within five days, a list of remaining projects that require approval by the Energy Bureau and will be submitted to FEMA and/or COR-3.

4. On June 15, 2021, LUMA filed Motion in Compliance with June 8th Resolution and Order and Request for Technical Workshop. Among others, LUMA explained that the list of the one-hundred and thirty-two (132) Transmission and Distribution projects (“T&D projects”) in PREPA’s short list of projects outlined in the 10-year Infrastructure Plan, was being used by LUMA in connection with the short-term projects being progressed with FEMA and COR-3.

5. In the June 15th LUMA Submission, LUMA also referenced Attachment 1 to its Response Number 9 to the Requests for Information issued by the Energy Bureau in the technical conference held in Case No. NEPR-MI-2021-0004 on LUMA’s proposed Initial Budgets, (TC-RFI-LUMA-MI-21-0004-210503-PREB-009, Attachment 1, filed on May 7, 2021, Case No. NEPR-MI-2021-0004), and explained that it includes the list of the one-hundred and thirty (132) T&D projects submitted to FEMA and COR3 and that LUMA was using said information in connection with the short-term projects that need approvals from FEMA and COR-3.

6. On July 2, 2021, this honorable Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order granting a request by LUMA to hold a conference in this proceeding (“July 2nd Order”). The Energy Bureau convened a technical conference to be held on July 12, 2021 at 9:30 a.m., “to discuss the streamlining of the work involved in the submittal of the [Scopes of Work] (“SOWs”) and other information requested by the Energy Bureau for its evaluation.” *See* July 2nd Order at page 2.

7. In the July 2nd Order, the Energy Bureau also directed that LUMA would have five days to file “(i) a list of the remaining projects [that] requir[e] Energy Bureau approval . . . [and] will be submitted to FEMA and COR[-]3; and (ii) any updates or revisions to the March 2021 Revised 10-Year Plan.” July 2nd Order at page 3.

8. On July 6, 2021, LUMA and PREPA jointly filed an update to the 10-Year Infrastructure work plan and a 90-day work plan. *See* Joint Motion Submitting Updated 10-Year Infrastructure Work Plan.

9. In compliance with the July 2nd Order, LUMA hereby submits as Exhibit 1, a list itemizing the original 132 T&D projects, and their updated status. As will be discussed in the Technical Conference on July 12, 2021, LUMA has continued to review and develop the original federally funded projects. LUMA made some minor changes to the grouping of the original FEMA projects. This includes separating some of the original 132 projects into multiple LUMA projects and merging some of the original 132 projects into one LUMA project. This is for operational, sequencing and tracking reasons. As LUMA representatives may further explain, does not alter any of the original scopes of work approved by the Bureau. For the Bureau’s benefit, LUMA has mapped the original project count in Column A, to its updated project numbering and in Column F.

10. Using LUMA’s project count in Column F, as of July 7, 2021, LUMA now presents 37 approved projects and 103 projects awaiting approval for a total of 140 projects. As LUMA continues its federally funded planning, it anticipates to add approximately fifteen (15) projects to this list. These projects are still in the planning phase and have not been sufficiently defined to be

included in the list. LUMA will provide an updated FEMA project list once these projects have been further defined.

11. In addition, LUMA hereby submits as Exhibit 2 the SOWs for twenty-eight (28) T&D projects for this Energy Bureau's thirty (30) day review and approval prior to submittal to COR-3 and/or FEMA. *See* March 26 Resolution and Order issued in this matter at page 14.

WHEREFORE, LUMA respectfully requests that the Energy Bureau **take notice** of the aforementioned, **accept** the list of projects that is submitted as Exhibit 1 to this Motion, approve the twenty-eight (28) SOWs for T&D projects submitted as Exhibit 2 to this Motion; and **deem** that LUMA timely complied with that portion of the July 2nd Order that required a list of the projects to be submitted to FEMA and COR-3.
