SUBJECT: Establishing the time for the June 10, 2022, Virtual Technical Conference; and the June 17, 2022, Virtual Public Hearing

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On May 19, 2022, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order ("May 19 Order"), through which, among other things, established the procedural calendar for the instant case.¹ The May 19 Order established a Virtual Technical Conference to be held on June 10, 2022, and a Virtual Public Hearing on June 17, 2022 (collectively, "Virtual Hearings"). The May 19 Order did not specify the hour for the Virtual Hearings.

On May 23, 2022, LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (collectively, "LUMA") filed a document titled *Motion Requesting Agenda for Virtual Technical Conference Scheduled for June 10, 2022* ("May 23 Motion"). In the May 23 Motion, LUMA is requesting that the Energy Bureau prepare an agenda for the Technical Conference scheduled for June 10, 2022, to allow LUMA to prepare a more responsive presentation and avoid potential additional efforts from LUMA or the Energy Bureau.²

The Energy Bureau **ESTABLISHES** that the Virtual Technical Conference scheduled for **June 10, 2022, shall be from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** and the Virtual Public Hearing scheduled for **June 17, 2022, shall be from 10:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.**

As the party who prepared and requested approval for the FY 2023 Annual Budget, LUMA is in a better position to propose an Agenda to be utilized in the June 10, 2022, Technical Conference. The Energy Bureau welcomes LUMA's suggestion and **ORDERS** LUMA to file a proposed Agenda **on or before June 3, 2022.**

The Energy Bureau **ORDERS LUMA** and the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("**PREPA**") to ensure that the personnel and/or consultants appear during the Technical Conference and be fully prepared to respond to questions on the proposed FY 2023 Annual Budgets by the Energy Bureau, its staff, and consultants.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS LUMA** and **PREPA** that, noncompliance with any provision of this Resolution and Order, may result in the imposition of fines under Act 57-2014 and applicable Energy Bureau's regulations and/or any other appropriate administrative sanctions, as deemed appropriate by the Energy Bureau.

All other aspects of the May 19 Order remain unaltered.


