**SUBJECT**: Resolution regarding *Request for* Extension of Time to Submit Informative on **Preliminary** Monthly Reconciliation of FCA, PPCA, and FOS Riders Factors, filed by LUMA Energy ServCo.

## **RESOLUTION**

On August 10, 2022, LUMA Energy ServCo ("LUMA") filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") a document titled Request for Extension of Time to Submit Informative Motion on Preliminary Monthly Reconciliation of FCA, PPCA, and FOS Riders Factors ("August 10 Motion"). Through the August 10 Motion, LUMA stated that despite its better efforts to obtain the fuel purchases, costs, and consumption data, the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") did not provide the same with sufficient time for LUMA to review them and finalize the calculations to timely submit before the Energy Bureau the preliminary reconciliation on or before August 12, 2022.1 Given the aforementioned delay in receiving necessary data on fuel for July 2022, LUMA indicated it needs two (2) additional business days to complete its analysis of the underlying relevant data, finalize calculations, and submit a motion to inform the Energy Bureau of the fuel and purchased power costs for July 2022.<sup>2</sup> Thus, LUMA requested a brief extension until August 16, 2022, to file the preliminary monthly reconciliation.<sup>3</sup>

Upon review of the August 10 Motion, the Energy Bureau GRANTS LUMA until August 16, 2022, as requested, to submit its preliminary reconciliation of the Fuel Charge Adjustment Rider ("FCA"), the Purchased Power Charge Adjustment Rider ("PPCA"), and the Fuel Oil Subsidy Rider ("FOS") costs for July 2022.

The Energy Bureau **REMINDS** PREPA of its obligation to timely submit the necessary information to LUMA to ensure the Energy Bureau receives the best and most updated information on this important matter opportunely.

The Energy Bureau WARNS LUMA and PREPA that, noncompliance with the provisions of this Resolution, may result in the imposition of fines pursuant to Article 6.36 of Act 57-2014.4
