**INFORMATIVE MOTION ON PRELIMINARY MONTHLY RECONCILIATION OF  
FCA, PPCA, AND FOS RIDERS FACTORS**

**TO THE HONORABLE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:**

**COMES** now **LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC** (“ServCo”), (“LUMA”), and respectfully states and requests the following:

1. LUMA’s duties over system regulatory matters pursuant to Section 5.6 of the Puerto Rico Transmission and Distribution Operation and Maintenance Agreement (“T&D OMA”) as supplemented by the Puerto Rico Transmission and Distribution System Supplemental Terms Agreement, include preparation of the required reconciliations for the Fuel Clause Adjustment (“FCA”) and Purchased Power Clause Adjustment (“PPCA”) riders.

2. LUMA must file the results of the calculations on the monthly reconciliation of the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority’s (“PREPA”) fuel purchases and the purchased power costs if said costs exceed the \$20 million variance threshold set by this Energy Bureau.

3. On August 10, 2022, LUMA filed before the Energy Bureau a *Request for Extension of Time to Submit Informative Motion on Preliminary Monthly Reconciliation of FCA, PPCA, and FOS Riders Factors*. Therein, LUMA stated PREPA did not provide certified fuel

purchase, generation, and consumption reports with sufficient time for LUMA to calculate the reconciliation and notify this Energy Bureau if the amount exceeded \$20 million variance on or before August 12, 2022. Thus, LUMA requested a brief extension until August 16, 2022, to, if necessary, file the monthly reconciliation for July 2022.

4. On August 12, 2022, the Energy Bureau entered a Resolution and Order, whereas it granted LUMA until August 16, 2022, to submit the reconciliation for PREPA's fuel purchases and the purchased power costs for July 2022.

5. On August 12, 2022, LUMA received, from PREPA, the necessary certified data to calculate the required reconciliation. LUMA hereby informs the Energy Bureau that the variance for July 2022 does not exceed the \$20 million threshold required to submit an informative reconciliation of PREPA's fuel purchases and purchased power costs for July 2022.

**WHEREFORE**, LUMA respectfully requests that the Energy Bureau **take notice** of the aforementioned.
