**SUBJECT: Request for Extension of Time to Submit  
Informative Motion on Preliminary Monthly  
Reconciliation of FCA, PPCA, and FOS Riders Factors**

**REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO SUBMIT INFORMATIVE MOTION ON  
PRELIMINARY MONTHLY RECONCILIATION OF FCA, PPCA, AND FOS RIDERS  
FACTORS**

**TO THE HONORABLE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:**

COMES now LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (“ServCo”), (“LUMA”), and respectfully states and requests the following:

1. LUMA’s duties over system regulatory matters pursuant to Section 5.6 of the Puerto Rico Transmission and Distribution Operation and Maintenance Agreement (“T&D OMA”) as supplemented by the Puerto Rico Transmission and Distribution System Supplemental Terms Agreement, include preparation of the required reconciliations for the Fuel Clause Adjustment (“FCA”) and Purchased Power Clause Adjustment (“PPCA”) riders.

2. To keep the Energy Bureau informed of the results of the calculations on the reconciliation of the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority’s (“PREPA”) fuel purchases and the purchased power costs for July 2022, LUMA will prepare and file with this Energy Bureau on or before August 12, 2022, a preliminary reconciliation of the FCA, PPCA, and Fuel Oil Subsidy

(“FOS”) factors for July 2022 with preliminary data that LUMA should receive from the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority (“PREPA”).

3. It is respectfully informed that despite its better efforts to obtain the fuel purchases, costs, and consumption data, PREPA did not provide the same with sufficient time for LUMA to review the same and finalize the calculations to timely submit with this Energy Bureau the preliminary reconciliation on or before August 12, 2022.

4. Given the aforementioned delay in receiving necessary data on fuel for July 2022, LUMA needs two additional business days to complete its analysis of the underlying relevant data, finalize calculations and submit a motion to inform this Energy Bureau of the fuel and purchased power costs for July 2022. Thus, LUMA requests a brief extension until August 16, 2022, to file the preliminary monthly reconciliation.

5. This request for extension is filed in good faith and should not delay the Energy Bureau’s processes related to receipt of the information on monthly fuel and purchased power costs.

6. As LUMA has explained in prior filings, it does not own or operate generation facilities nor purchase any fuel for generation. LUMA’s operations costs are not included in the FCA and PPCA riders. The tariff book requires the calculation of the riders to assure the pass-through of costs for fuel used in generation by PREPA and the power purchased from private generators by PREPA is performed in line with regulation, without any markup, profit, or additional charges that would benefit PREPA (or LUMA).

**WHEREFORE**, LUMA respectfully requests that the Energy Bureau **take notice** of the aforementioned and **grant** LUMA until August 16, 2022, to inform this Energy Bureau of the preliminary reconciliation of FCA, PPCA, and FOS riders' costs for July 2022.
