SUBJECT: Initial Generation Stabilization Plan ("GSP") Update – Scheduling of Technical Conference.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On October 12, 2022, the Puerto Rico Energy Bureau of the Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") ordered LUMA¹ to develop a Generation Stabilization Plan ("GSP") in coordination with the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") and the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") to mitigate the impact of Hurricane Fiona on the generation fleet by addressing any baseload generation inadequacy or shortfall that affects dispatch availability and has the potential to cause load shedding or a blackout event of the electric system.²

Given the urgency of identifying mechanisms that can be expeditiously deployed to mitigate the impact of Hurricane Fiona on generation, the Energy Bureau directed LUMA to provide on the 1st and 15th day of each month update reports addressing the efforts conducted by LUMA to assure the completion of the GSP.³

For the initial GSP update, the Energy Bureau **ORDERS** LUMA to participate in a Technical Conference to provide the status of the different stages of the GSP. Specifically, the Energy Bureau is interested in learning about the (1) U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("USACE") Generation Assessment underway, (2) Emergency Temporary Generation under a potential FEMA Public Assistance Emergency assignment that can expeditiously mitigate the impact of Hurricane Fiona, and (3) Replacement of Emergency Temporary Generation that seeks to phase out the temporary generation with permanent capacity, noting that this permanent capacity is consistent with the approved Integrated Resource Plan ("IRP").⁴ This Virtual Technical Conference will be held on **Tuesday, November 1, 2022 at 1:00pm.**

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** LUMA that, noncompliance with any provision of this Resolution and Order, may result in the imposition fines under Act 57- 2014 and the applicable Energy Bureau's regulations and/or any other appropriate administrative sanctions, as considered appropriate by the Energy Bureau.
