**SUBJECT:** Order to Compel Responses to the Energy Bureau's 10<sup>th</sup> Requirements of Information to LUMA.

## **RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

On November 16, 2022, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued its Tenth Requirement of Information ("ROI 10") to LUMA,<sup>1</sup> which included fifty-seven (57) questions to be answered on or before November 28, 2022. On November 18, 2022, LUMA filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Motion Requesting a Brief Extension for LUMA to Answer the Energy Bureau's 10th Requirement of Information* ("November 18 Request"). Through the November 18 Request, LUMA requested five additional days from the deadline of November 28, 2022, to respond to ROI 10. On November 22, 2022, the Energy Bureau granted LUMA's November 18 Request and provided an extension through December 5, 2022.

On December 5, 2022, LUMA filed a document titled *Urgent Motion Requesting an Additional Brief Extension of a Few Hours for LUMA to Answer the Energy Bureau's 10th Requirement of Information* ("December 5 Request"). LUMA requested an additional extension of a few hours, past the 5:00 p.m. deadline, to respond to ROI 10.<sup>2</sup>

On December 5, 2022, LUMA served a document titled *LUMA's Responses to PREB's 10th Requirement of Information* ("ROI 10 Responses"). As for two of the information requests, numbered 48 and 49 (respectively, PREB-LUMA-10-48 and PREB-LUMA-10-49), LUMA objected to these requests and indicated that it had not prepared the requested formal analyses to file publicly. Concerning PREB-LUMA-10-48, LUMA further indicated that it would require 1-2 months to provide the requested information, should it be required to do so in response to an order from the Energy Bureau.

LUMA's objections to PREB-LUMA-10-48 and PREB-LUMA-10-49 were substantially the same. To wit, LUMA indicated these information requests fell outside of the scope of the ongoing proceeding, which, per the Energy Bureau's past orders, is limited to LUMA's Supplemental Written Testimonies on Additional Metrics and the amended parts of the Revised Annex IX to the Puerto Rico Transmission and Distribution System Operation and Maintenance Agreement (T&D OMA), collectively filed on October 28, 2022. LUMA further objected to PREB-LUMA-10-48 and PREB-LUMA-10-49 because these information requests pertained to respectively, LUMA's performance in FY2022 and LUMA's performance during Hurricane Fiona, neither of which are at issue in the instant proceeding.

Upon review of LUMA's objections, the Energy Bureau DETERMINES that PREB-LUMA-10-48 and PREB-LUMA-10-49 are needed and require suitable responses by LUMA. The Energy Bureau's duty in the instant proceeding is to determine that the Revised Annex IX complies with applicable energy policy directives. The requested information is pertinent and discoverable as part of the subject matter of the instant case.

Further, the Energy Bureau **CLARIFIES** that, for regulatory matters, the Energy Bureau is not bound or limited by the T&D OMA, as established in its Section 20.17. Neither is the Energy Bureau bound or limited by any of its orders applicable to the parties, including the intervenors, regarding the permissible scope of any Requirements of Information it may issue to further obtain a comprehensive and thorough administrative file.
