RESOLUTION

I. Introduction

On July 14, 2022, Sunnova Energy Corporation ("Sunnova Energy") filed under seal before the Energy Bureau of the Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") a document titled *Motion to Deposit Annual Fee Amounts and to Request Confidential Treatment of Information* ("July 14 Motion")¹. Sunnova included as Attachment 1 a company check and a breakdown of the amount included in the check.

On December 14, 2022, the Energy Bureau, issued a Resolution and Order ("December 14 Resolution")² ordering Sunnova Energy, among other things, to submit a detailed explanation with supporting documents to sustain the gross revenue calculated for the electrical service provided and used by Sunnova Energy to estimate the regulatory fee as presented in the Attachment 1 of the July 14 Motion for the years 2014 up to year 2020.

On December 16, 2022, Sunnova Energy filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled Request for Extension to Comply with Resolution and Order dated December 14, 2022, and for Confidential Treatment of Information ("December 16 Request")³. Through the December 16 Request, Sunnova Energy request a thirty (30) days extension to provide the information requested by the Energy Bureau on the December 14 Resolution. On December 21, 2022, the Energy Bureau granted the additional 30 days to comply with the December 14 Resolution.⁴

On December 27, 2022, Sunnova Energy filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Motion in Compliance with Resolution and Order Dated December 21, 2022, and Request for Confidential Treatment of Information ("December 27 Motion")*⁵. Sunnova submitted the information requested in the December 14 Resolution.

Pursuant to Section 6.16 of Act No. 57-2014⁶ the Energy Bureau budget is computed based on an annual regulatory fee as established by the Energy Bureau that comes from the annual gross income of the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") and all others Electric Service Companies in Puerto Rico.

Section 4.03 of Regulation 9182⁷ provides that the Energy Bureau shall calculate the regulatory annual fees that correspond to each of the Electric Service Companies based on a pro-rata factor.

II. Analysis

On April 11, 2019, Act 17-2019, known as the *Puerto Rico Energy Public Policy Act* ("Act 17-2019"), entered into force. Among other things, Act 17-2019 amended Section 6.16 of Act 57-2014 for the purpose of modifying the budget of the Energy Bureau and the way in which the origin of the necessary funds to cover said budget is determined.

As established in the amended Article 6.16 of Act 57-2014, as of Fiscal Year 2019-2020, the budget of the Energy Bureau will be twenty million dollars for each fiscal year. Said budget is based on the gross income of each natural year for PREPA and for the Electric Service Companies.

The change in Law gave rise to the amendment of Article 4 of Regulation 8701⁸ on the computation of annual charges for regulation and their collection by the Energy Bureau. Said amendment is included in Section 2.12 of Regulation 9182.

The Energy Bureau analyzed the data submitted by Sunnova Energy for the fiscal years 2021 and 2022, which rely on the Energy Service Companies financial information for the calendar years 2019 and 2020, respectively, given that those were the applicable years after the amendment to Regulation 8701 – known as Regulation 9182 dated June 24, 2020 – whereby Energy Service Companies would each pay their proportional share based on the revenues of the totality of the certified Energy Service Companies in Puerto Rico of \$20,000,000, Energy Bureau's budget.

Upon evaluating the data submitted by Sunnova, the Energy Bureau concluded that Sunnova Energy paid to the Energy Bureau an amount in excess of what is required under Regulation 9182. Therefore, the Energy Bureau has the obligation to refund the Energy Service Companies for the excess annual dues paid for fiscal years 2021 and 2022 due to Sunnova's initial exclusion.

III. Conclusion

The Energy Bureau analyzed the information submitted by Sunnova Energy on the December 27 Motion and **DETERMINED** that for fiscal years 2021 and 2022, which rely on the Energy Services Companies' financial information for the calendar years 2019 and 2020, respectively, there is an exceed in the amount paid by each of the Electric Service Companies that should be reimbursed to each one. The credit balance driven by the changes of Law that required Energy Service Companies to pay their proportional share – based on the proportion of their revenues to the total revenues of all of the Energy Service Companies – of \$20,000.000.00

The Energy Bureau **ESTABLISHES** the funds to be returned as follow:
