**SUBJECT:** Determination of LUMA Request for Extension of Time to Submit Consolidated FY2024 Proposed Annual Budgets and Amend the Procedural Calendar

## **RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

### I. Introduction

On April 11, 2023, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order ("April 11 Resolution") in which, among others, it established the procedural calendar in the instant case.

On April 28, 2023, LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (jointly referred as, "LUMA") filed a document titled *Urgent Request for Additional Extension of Time to Submit Consolidated FY2024 Proposed Annual Budgets and for Modification of Procedural Calendar* ("April 28 Request"), through which, LUMA requests that the Energy Bureau extend the filing date of the consolidated FY2023 Proposed Annual Budgets from May 1, 2023 to May 8, 2023 to allow the Puerto Rico Public-Private Partnership Authority ("P3A") to notify its Budget Allocation Determination.<sup>1</sup> LUMA also presented a proposed procedural calendar for the Energy Bureau's consideration.<sup>2</sup> LUMA indicates that both the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") and Genera PR LLC ("Genera") confirmed agreement with the extension request and proposed procedural calendar.<sup>3</sup>

Through the April 28 Request, LUMA alleges that as of the date of the April 28 Request, the consolidated FY2024 Proposed Annual Budgets remain under review and subject to modifications depending on the final budget allocation determined by P3A.<sup>4</sup>

The Energy Bureau highlights the importance of timely evaluation and approval of PREPA's FY2024 Annual Budgets. The timely evaluation, however, depends in part upon the development of a consolidated budget proposal that reflects an appropriate budget allocation between PREPA's components.

#### II. Conclusion

For the reasons set forth above, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** LUMA's request for extension until May 8, 2023, for of the consolidated FY 2024 Proposed Annual Budgets.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** all the parties that their full cooperation is required in order to present a consolidated FY2023 Proposed Annual Budgets that encompasses the

requirements of the Energy Bureau. The Energy Bureau **REMINDS** the parties that it is not bound by the T&D OMA<sup>5</sup>, the Generation OMA<sup>6</sup> or the PGHOA<sup>7</sup>.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** LUMA, GENERA and PREPA that:

(i) noncompliance with this Resolution and Order, regulations and/or applicable laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions of up to \$25,000 per day;

(ii) any person who intentionally violates Act 57-2014, as amended, by omitting, disregarding, or refusing to obey, observe, and comply with any rule or decision of the Energy Bureau shall be punished by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) nor over five thousand dollars (\$5,000) at the discretion of the Energy Bureau; and

(iii) for any recurrence of non-compliance or violation, the established penalty shall increase to a fine of not less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) nor greater than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), at the discretion of the Energy Bureau.
