SUBJECT: Resolution pertaining *Urgent Request for Extension to Submit Information in Compliance with Resolution and Order Dated May 18, 2023*, filed by LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC and *Urgent Request for a Brief Extension of Time to Comply with the May 18 Resolution and Order and Request for Remedy*, filed by the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority.

RESOLUTION

On May 18, 2023, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order ("May 18 Resolution") through which it ordered GENERA PR, LLC ("Genera"), through LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC ("LUMA"), to provide on or before 12:00p.m. on Monday, May 22, 2023, a detailed GenCo Operating and Capital Expenditures Budget that reflects the LUMA Budget Request in Schedule 3.1 "Annual Budget Summary" with all the supporting documentation used to substantiate the request.

Through the May 18 Resolution, the Energy Bureau ordered the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA"), through LUMA, to provide a detailed HydroCo Operating and Capital Expenditures Budget and a detailed HoldCo Operating and Capital Expenditures Budget that reflects the LUMA Budget Request in Schedule 3.1 "Annual Budget Summary" with all the supporting documentation used to substantiate the request.

On May 22, 2023, LUMA filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Urgent Request for Extension to Submit Information in Compliance with Resolution and Order Dated May 18, 2023* ("May 22 LUMA Motion"), through which it informed that counsel for Genera notified LUMA that it required an extension until today at 6:00 p.m. to finalize its submission in compliance with the May 18 Resolution.¹

Also, on May 22, 2023, PREPA filed before the Energy Bureau a document titled *Urgent Request for a Brief Extension of Time to Comply with the May 18 Resolution and Order and Request for Remedy* ("May 22 PREPA Motion"). In its May 22 Motion, PREPA requested two more days to comply with the May 18 Resolution.² PREPA also requested leave for its own counsel to submit directly to the Energy Bureau all motions, documents, and requests about the Proposed HydroCo Budget and the Proposed HoldCo Budget.³

Upon review of the May 22 Motions, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** Genera, through LUMA, until **6:00 p.m. today**, to comply with the May 18 Resolution.

The Energy Bureau **DENIES** PREPA's request for remedy and **GRANTS** PREPA, through LUMA, until **Wednesday, May 24, 2023**, to comply with the May 18 Resolution.


