RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On March 27, 2024, PR SOLAR D1, LLC ("PR SOLAR D1") filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") a document titled *Motion to Request Cancellation of Registration* ("March 27 Motion"), with the attached documents: (i) *Gross Revenue and Financial Statements Report Electric Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B05), (ii) *Operational Report Electrical Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B03) and (iii) copy of email sent referring its Operational Report to the EPPP.

In the March 27 Motion, PR SOLAR D1 requested to cancel their certification as an electric service company and indicates: "... that the project with its single client, which was the reason for PR Solar to request the electric company certification, was cancelled and PR Solar no longer intends to engage in the provision of electric services in Puerto Rico."¹

Section 6.4(b) of Act 57-2014 establishes that:

(b) The Energy Bureau shall have general jurisdiction over the following matters:

- (1) The Energy Bureau shall have regulatory, investigative, and adjudicative jurisdiction over PREPA and any other certified electric power company providing services within the Government of Puerto Rico.
 - (2) Any natural or juridical person that violates the provisions of this Act in connection with energy-related matters or the regulations of the Bureau, including any natural or juridical person or entity exercising control over electric power services to commit said violations.
 - (3) Any natural or juridical person whose actions affect the provision of electric power services, including any person or entity exercising control over such services to affect the provision thereof.
 - (4) Any natural or juridical person that carries out any activity for which a certification, authorization, or permit issued by the Energy Bureau is needed.
 - (5) Any natural or juridical person whose actions or omissions are in prejudice to the activities, resources, or interests over which the Bureau has regulatory, investigative, adjudicative, or oversight powers, including any person exercising control over electric power services in such a manner as to cause said prejudice.

The Energy Bureau **TAKES NOTICE** of the information filed by PR SOLAR D1 in the March 27 Motion and its attachments and **ORDERS** PR SOLAR D1 to file, **within five (5) days from the notification of this Resolution and Order**, (i) evidence that its single client was notified




by PR SOLAR D1 about the decision of cancelling the project and (ii) evidence that LUMA² has been notified about their decision.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** PR SOLAR D1 that:

- i. non-compliance with this Resolution and Order, regulations and/ or applicable laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions of up to \$25,000 per day;
- ii. Any person who intentionally violates Act 57-2014, as amended, by omitting, disregarding, or refusing to obey, observe, and comply with any rule or decision of the Energy Bureau shall be punished by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) nor over five thousand dollars (\$5,000) at the discretion of the Energy Bureau; and
- iii. For any recurrence of non-compliance or violation, the established penalty shall increase to a fine of not less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) nor greater than twenty thousand dollars (20,000) at the discretion of the Energy Bureau.



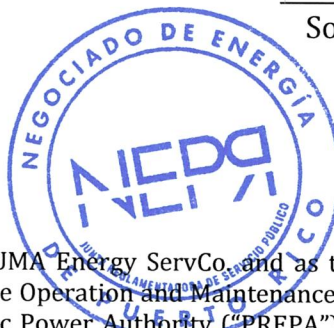
