RESOLUTION


On April 1, 2024, Sunrun, Inc (“SUNRUN”) filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board (“Energy Bureau”), a document titled *Motion to Request Confidential Treatment of 2024 Operational Report and Other Remedies* (“April 1 Motion”). SUNRUN included as Attachment 1 to the April 1 Motion the *Operational Report Electric Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B03) and the *2024 Operational Report Annexes* (“Annexes”), and as Attachment 2 a *Copy of a check for the payment of the Operational Report Fees*.

In the April 1 Request, SUNRUN requested that the information contained in the Attachment 1 be kept confidential alleging that such information is of sensitive nature, is not available to the public, and disclosure of such information would place SUNRUN at a competitive disadvantage and cause it economic harm.¹

Act No. 57-2014² establishes that any person having the obligation to submit information to the Energy Bureau, may request that any information deemed privileged or confidential be treated in such fashion.³ Specifically, Act 57-2014 requires from the Energy Bureau to treat as confidential the information submitted provided that “after the appropriate evaluation, believes such information should be protected”.² In such case, “the Energy Bureau shall grant such protection in a manner that least affects the public interest, transparency, and the rights of the parties involved in the administrative procedure in which the allegedly confidential document is submitted”.³

The Energy Bureau **TAKES NOTICE** of the information presented by SUNRUN in the April 1 Motion and upon a thorough examination of the arguments brought forth by SUNRUN, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** confidential designation and treatment to the **Attachments 1 and 2**, under Article 6.15 of Act 57-2014.


