IN RE: PUERTO RICO'S ELECTRIC SYSTEM | CASE NO.: NEPR-IN-2024-0004 LIQUIDITY CONCERNS

SUBJECT: Initiation of Investigation.

## **RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

On October 30 2024, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order ("October 30 Resolution") through which it initiated an inquiry into allegations concerning critical liquidity issues impacting LUMA1 within the framework of its existing docket, Case No.: NEPR-MI-2020-0001, In Re: Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority's Permanent Rate ("Approved Rate Docket"). Further, through the October 30 Resolution, the Energy Bureau designated Scott Hempling to serve as a Hearing Examiner to investigate and address these allegations.

On November 8, 2024, the Hearing Examiner filed a document before the Energy Bureau, recommending that the examination of the liquidity issues be addressed under a separate and distinct investigation docket. The Hearing Examiner also requested the Energy Bureau's confirmation of his intent to invite broad participation in this investigation.

Upon careful review of the Hearing Examiner's request, the Energy Bureau agrees that there is a need for a focused investigative process to address the referenced allegations and to better isolate these issues from the ongoing proceeding in the Approved Rate Docket. As such, the Energy Bureau **DETERMINES** that the complexity and critical nature of the liquidity issues warrant an independent and dedicated review. Establishing a separate investigation docket will enhance procedural clarity and allow for a thorough and specialized analysis of these financial matters without detracting from the primary objectives of the Approved Rate Docket. Additionally, addressing the liquidity concerns independently will better serve the interests of transparency and regulatory efficiency, ensuring a comprehensive examination that preserves the Energy Bureau's standards and regulatory integrity.



In view of the foregoing, the Energy Bureau GRANTS the Hearing Examiner's request to address the allegations of critical liquidity issues under a separate investigation docket and INITIATES this proceeding pursuant to Sections 6.3(bb) and 6.24(e) of Act 57-2014<sup>2</sup> and Article XV of Regulation 85433, under which the Hearing Examiner shall pursue all necessary inquiries, analysis, and reporting. As stated in the October 30 Resolution, the Hearing Examiner is authorized to take any procedural and substantive actions deemed necessary to advance the inquiry, including but not limited to issuing subpoenas, gathering relevant data, and conducting hearings.



The Energy Bureau's commitment to transparency is best served by including a broad range of participants, ensuring that diverse perspectives are heard, that the record is informed, and that the public is kept apprised of the proceedings. Given the high level of interest in these liquidity concerns, transparency in process and decision-making is essential to maintain public trust. Hence, to further the Energy Bureau's commitment to transparency, the Hearing Examiner is **GRANTED** authority to invite broad participation from interested stakeholders. This invitation process shall be structured to foster engagement from relevant entities, experts, and public representatives, to create a thorough and transparent administrative record.
