SUBJECT: LUMA Motion Requesting
Extension a time for filing of Second Interim
Filing.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On October 29, 2024, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board (“Energy Bureau”) issued a Resolution and Order establishing a revised filing schedule in the instant case (“October 29 Order”). Pursuant to the October 20 Order, LUMA¹ was required to file the following on or before February 28, 2025: (i) input assumptions and results describing the least cost resource portfolios for scenarios number 5 through 10 and resource portfolio number 11; (ii) uncertainty analysis results for the least cost resource portfolios for scenarios number 1 through 6 and resource portfolio number 11; (iii) sensitivities of the resource portfolios; (iv) results from the stakeholder meetings held to share preliminary results and seek feedback prior to the selection of the Preferred Portfolio; (v) LUMA’s recommended Preferred Portfolio; and (vi) summary description of the Preferred Portfolio (collectively the “Second Interim Filing”).

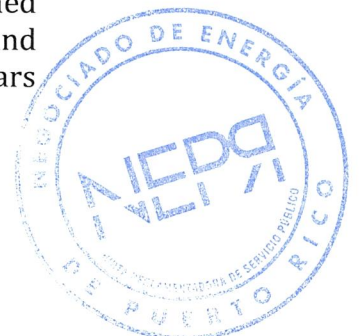
On February 26, 2025, LUMA filed a document titled *Motion Requesting Extension of Time To Submit 2025 IRP Second Interim Filing And Modification Of The 2025 IRP Flexibility Analysis For Each Portfolio* (“Motion”). According to LUMA, while it has completed Scenarios 1 to 8, it has been unable to complete Scenarios 9 and 10 due to emerging issues in the inputs of the model, which, if left unaddressed, may impact the accuracy and reliability of the results. LUMA indicated that these issues required adjustments to the model’s parameters and additional validation steps to ensure the results were accurate and aligned with expectations. LUMA explained that given the need to identify feasible solutions that enable obtaining accurate results, the timeline for completion of Scenario 9 and Scenario 10 has been delayed and needs additional time. LUMA requested until March 27, 2025, to file the 2025 IRP Second Interim Filing.

After a thorough review of the Motion, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** LUMA until **March 27, 2025** to file Second Interim Filing.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** LUMA that:

- (i) noncompliance with this Resolution and Order, regulations and/or applicable laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions of up to \$25,000 per day;
- (ii) any person who intentionally violates Act 57-2014, as amended, by omitting, disregarding, or refusing to obey, observe, and comply with any rule or decision of the Energy Bureau shall be punished by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) nor over five thousand dollars (\$5,000) at the discretion of the Energy Bureau; and
- (iii) for any recurrence of non-compliance or violation, the established penalty shall increase to a fine of not less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) nor greater than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), at the discretion of the Energy Bureau.


