**MOTION SUBMITTING QUARTERLY REPORT ON STREETLIGHTS
REPAIRS FOR APRIL THROUGH JUNE 2025**

TO THE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:

COME NOW LUMA Energy, LLC, and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC, (jointly referred to as “LUMA”), through the undersigned legal counsel and respectfully submit the following:

1. On June 28, 2020, the Puerto Rico Energy Bureau (“Energy Bureau”) issued a Resolution and Order (“June 28th Order”) whereby it ordered the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority (“PREPA”) to submit a report regarding the electroluminescent or renewable type public lighting luminaires installed during the previous month (the “Streetlights Repairs Report”). The stated purpose of the Streetlight Repairs Report is for the Energy Bureau to verify compliance with Act 17-2019,¹ and collect the necessary information for the annual reconciliation and calculation of the help to human subsidy (“SUBA-HH”) adjustment factor. *See* June 28th Order, p. 21.

2. Per a Resolution and Order dated August 29, 2023, the current cadence to file the Streetlights Repairs Report is quarterly (“August 29th Order”).²

3. In compliance with the Energy Bureau’s June 28th Order,³ as modified by the August 29th Order, LUMA hereby submits as *Exhibit 1*, the Streetlights Repairs Report with data updated for April, May and June 2025.

WHEREFORE, LUMA respectfully requests that the Energy Bureau **take notice** of the aforementioned and of the Streetlights Repairs Report filed herewith with data updated for April, May and June 2025, and **deem** LUMA in compliance with the June 28th Order, as modified by the August 29th Order.

² On April 10, 2023, LUMA filed a motion styled *Motion Submitting Report on Streetlight Repairs for March 2023 and Request for Modification of Reporting Frequency* (“April 10th Motion”) whereby it submitted the Streetlights Repairs Report for March 2023. LUMA also included a request for the Energy Bureau to reduce the frequency for submitting the Streetlight Repairs Report from monthly to quarterly to allow said reports to be more closely aligned with the frequency for reconciliation and calculation of the factor for the SUBA-HH rider and other progress reports that LUMA provides to the Energy Bureau quarterly. On August 18, 2023, LUMA filed a *Motion Reiterating Request to Modify the Cadence of the Report on Streetlight Repairs* (“August 18th Motion”), whereby LUMA reiterated its request for this Honorable Energy Bureau to modify the frequency of the Streetlights Repair Report from monthly to quarterly.

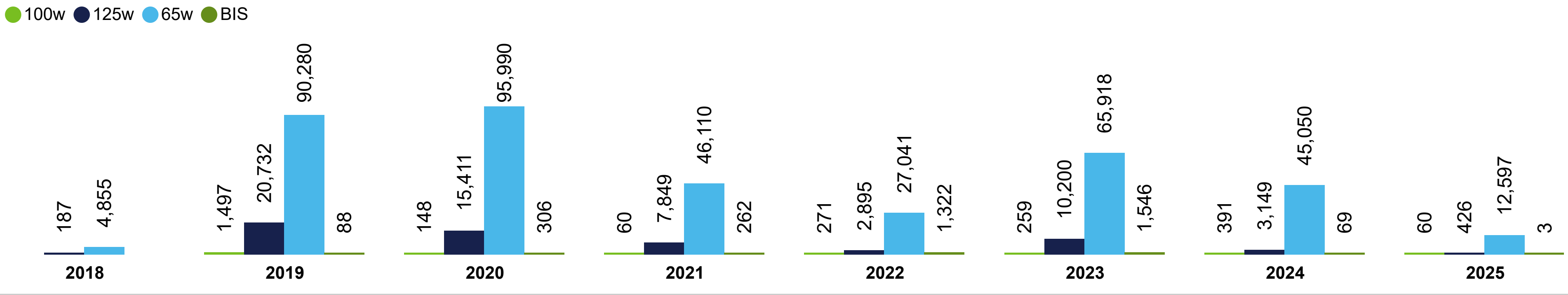

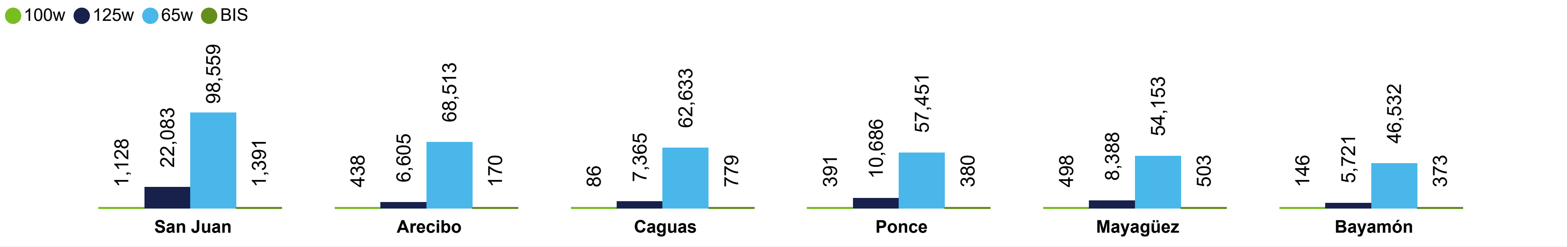

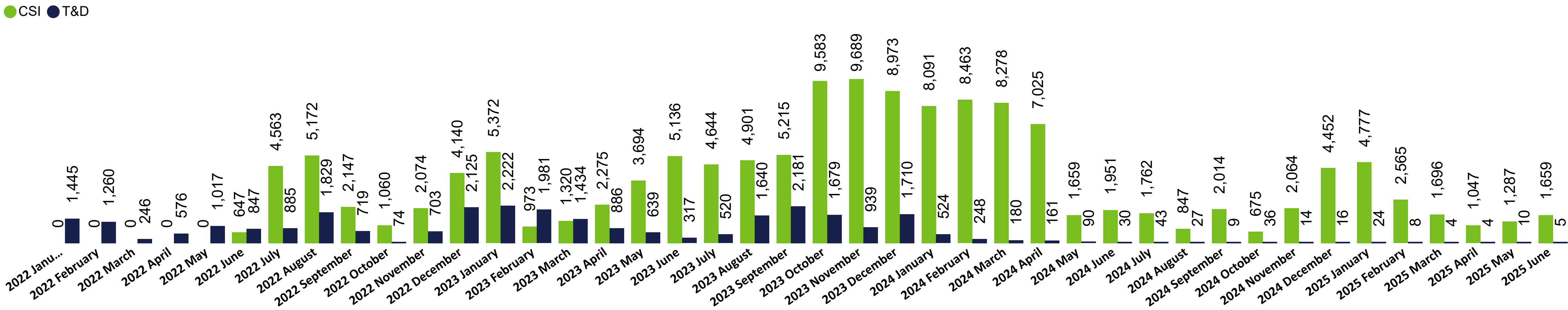
Streetlights Back in Service by Year



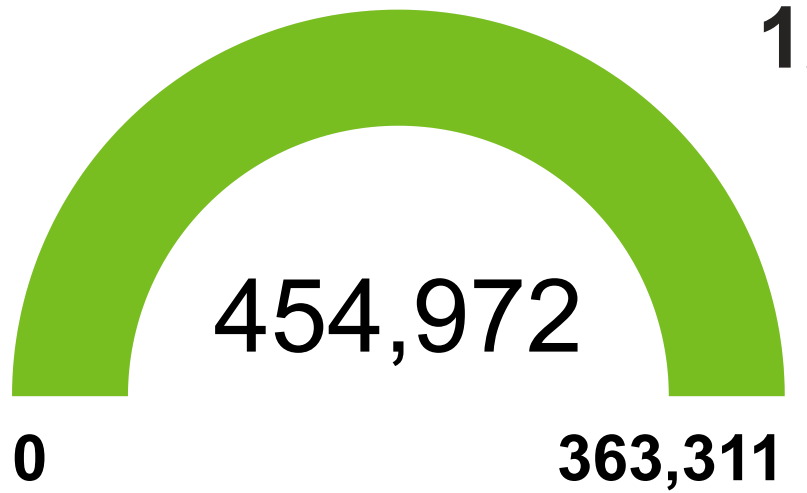
Streetlights Back in Service by Region



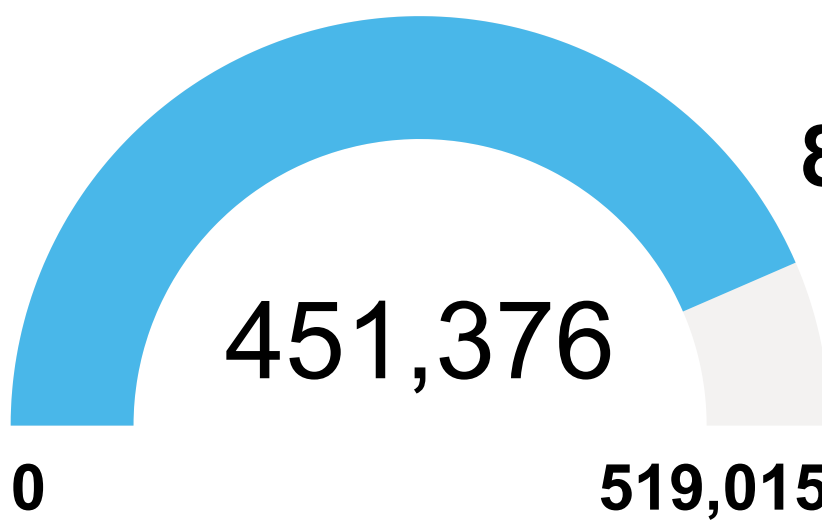
Streetlights Back in Service by Month
