## RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On June 20, 2025, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order ("June 20 Resolution"), granting Ligueto Operating PR SA, LLC ("Ligueto"), fifteen (15) days to submit the credentials of the entities contracted to operate its system, as required under Section 2.02 (A)(1J(d) of Regulation 8701,¹ and to describe what services, equipment, and systems the contracted entity will operate.

On July 8, 2025, Ligueto filed a document titled *Motion to in Compliance with June 23 Resolution and Order and Request for Confidential Treatment* ("July 8 Motion") to submit the credentials of the two (2) entities contracted to operate its system accompanied by the following:

Attachment 1 - Redacted and Unredacted version of the July 8 Motion, including the following redacted and unredacted documents:

- a. Certificates of Existence by the Puerto Rico Department of State, dated July 8, 2025.
- b. Certificates of Good Standing by the Puerto Rico Department of State, dated July 8, 2025.
- c. Description of the history, corporate structure, expertise, private projects, government funded projects, electric system installed, corporative practices, regulatory compliance, community outreach, areas of service.
- d. Principal technical personnel, its academic preparation, professional registration, certifications, memberships, project experience.
- e. Puerto Rico Department of State License as license engineers.
- f. DDEC Certificate of Renewable Energy System Installer.
- g. Certificate of Solar Energy Design and Installation.

Ligueto requested confidential treatment of the July 8 Motion and the attached documents. Ligueto submitted both redacted and unredacted versions of July 8 Motion in compliance with: (i) Section 6.15 of Act 57-2014<sup>2</sup>; (ii) Section 1.15 of Regulation 8701; and (iii) *In Re: Policy on Management of Confidential Information in Procedures before the Commission*, Case No.: CEPR-MI-2016-0009, Resolution and Order issued on August 31, 2016 ("Confidential Treatment Resolution").

Upon reviewing the documents, the Energy Bureau **TAKES NOTICE** of the information presented and **DETERMINES** Ligueto **COMPLIED** with Section 2.02 (A)(1J(d) of Regulation 8701 by submitting the credentials of the entities contracted to operate it system.

Notwithstanding, in the June 23 Resolution Ligueto was also required "to describe what services, equipment, and systems the contracted entity will operate". In the information

submitted with the July 8 Motion, Ligueto does not clearly describe the separation of responsibilities of each company.

As such, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** Ligueto an additional **ten (10) days** from the notification of this Resolution and Order, to fully comply with the information requested in the June 23 Resolution. Particularly, to describe what services, equipment, and systems each contracted entity will operate.

The Energy Bureau **GRANTS** confidential designation and treatment to the July 8 Motion and the included documents as Attachment 1, pursuant to Act 57-2014 and Regulation 8701.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** Ligueto that in accordance with Art. 6.36 of Act 57-2014 non-compliance with this Resolution and Order, regulations and/or applicable laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions.
