RESOLUTION AND ORDER

Considering the Department of Energy of the United States of America Emergency Orders 202-25-1 and 202-25-2 issued on May 16, 2025, the Governor of Puerto Rico, Hon. Jenniffer A. González Colón, on September 22, 2025, issued Executive Order OE2025-047, which amended and expanded the Puerto Rico Energy Emergency and authorized extraordinary measures to accelerate the evaluation and approval of renewable energy and storage projects qualifying for federal investment tax credits ("ITCs") under Public Law 119-21, also known as the *One Big Beautiful Bill Act* ("OBBBA").

The Executive Order directs the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") to issue an order or resolution establishing the evaluation criteria applicable to the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") to assess proposals and recommendations for approval of renewable energy purchase agreements, with or without storage capacity.

OE-2025-047 seeks to expedite the integration of renewable energy projects so that Puerto Rico can capture the timeline and benefits of the ITCs, strengthening the electric system with modern, reliable, and affordable generation under an emergency framework that streamlines administrative and regulatory processes.

The Energy Bureau **CLARIFIES** that OE-2025-047 does not alter the course of projects that are part of **LUMA's¹ Accelerated Storage Addition Program ("ASAP") or any other negotiation (capacity increases and/or storage additions to projects already under contract) that PREPA had underway and is in final stages of completion. Such projects shall continue under the existing regulatory framework and the agreements already evaluated and/or approved. The Executive Order shall not be construed to require a restart or duplication of processes**.

The Energy Bureau **VACATES** the stay of the instant proceeding. In the interest of deploying additional utility scale battery capacity onto Puerto Rico's grid expeditiously, the Energy Bureau **ORDERS** LUMA to offer the Phase 1 Standard Offer Agreement to Phase 2 proponents that are interested and agree without reservations to accept the terms established thereby.

LUMA shall identify and notify potential candidates within **five (5) days** from the notification of this Resolution and Order, and within **five (5) days** thereafter shall proceed with the submittal of such contracts before the Energy Bureau for its review and approval.
