with Resolutions and Orders of February 5  
and February 11, 2026

**RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

On February 5, 2026, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order ("February 5 Resolution") addressing the Consolidated FEMA Accelerated Award Strategy ("FAASt") Project Plan ("Consolidated Project List") submitted by the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA"), LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (jointly "LUMA"), and Genera PR, LLC ("Genera"). The February 5 Resolution required LUMA to file, within fifteen (15) calendar days, an implementation plan detailing reconciliation of funding allocations, duplication of funding analysis, confirmation of project completeness, and timelines necessary to reactivate priority transmission and distribution ("T&D") projects under the Updated Allocation Framework.

On February 11, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a subsequent Resolution and Order ("February 11 Resolution") modifying Attachment A to the February 5 Resolution to reprioritize projects based on higher incurred costs and directing PREPA to amend the Consolidated Project List accordingly.

On February 17, 2026, LUMA filed a Motion Requesting Extension of Time to Comply with Resolutions and Orders of February 5 and February 11, 2026 ("February 17 Motion"). In its Motion, LUMA asserts that the revisions introduced through the February 11 Resolution materially affect the preparation of its required implementation plan, necessitating additional reconciliation and manual validation of project-level data. LUMA therefore requests a ten (10) day extension, until March 2, 2026, to comply with the February 5 and February 11 Resolutions.

The Energy Bureau has reviewed LUMA's request and **GRANTS** LUMA's petition for extension until **March 2, 2026**, to submit the information requested through the February 5 and February 11 Resolution.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** LUMA that, in accordance with Article 6.36 of Act 57-2014:

- i. Noncompliance with this Resolution and Order, applicable regulations, or laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions of up to one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) per day; and
- ii. In the event of recurrent violations or continued non-compliance, the penalty shall increase to no less than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) and up to two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) per violation, at the discretion of the Energy Bureau.






