REQUEST FOR RESCHEDULING OF TECHNICAL CONFERENCE

TO THE HONORABLE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:

COMES NOW the Puerto Rico Public-Private Partnerships Authority (“P3A”), by and through its undersigned counsel, and respectfully STATES and PRAYS as follows:

1. On March 18, 2026, the Puerto Rico Energy Bureau (“PREB” or the “Bureau”) issued a *Resolution and Order* in the above-captioned proceeding scheduling a Technical Conference for March 25, 2026, at 10:00 a.m., and ordering the participation, among others, of Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority (“PREPA”), Genera PR, LLC (“Genera”), and LUMA Energy, LLC (“LUMA”). The Bureau also required the participation of relevant stakeholders, including entities directly involved in fuel supply and generation matters, such as AES Puerto Rico, L.P. (“AES”) and EcoEléctrica.

2. P3A respectfully informs the Bureau that a critical, previously scheduled in-person meeting related to the extension of the Guayama Power Purchase and Operating Agreement (“PPOA”) between AES, PREPA and P3A is set to take place on March 25, 2026. The negotiations between the parties have progressed over several months to an advanced stage that requires in-person

engagement to resolve complex technical, financial, and contractual matters. Accordingly, the meeting has been scheduled as a multi-hour session of no less than six (6) hours, reflecting both the complexity of the issues under negotiation and their importance to system operations.

3. This meeting was coordinated weeks in advance and involves the participation of AES, PREPA and P3A senior management, as well as their corresponding technical personnel, financial advisors, legal counsel, and lenders, all of whom have confirmed attendance and have already made travel arrangements to Puerto Rico. AES has informed P3A that its full delegation has secured airline tickets and hotel accommodation under extremely constrained conditions due to the Spring Break travel period, during which availability is limited and largely sold out.

4. P3A respectfully acknowledges the importance of the Technical Conference scheduled by the Bureau and reiterates its commitment to fully participate and support the Bureau's inquiries. However, given the significance of these negotiations to the continuity and reliability of generation resources, and the extensive coordination already undertaken—including the confirmed participation of multiple technical, financial, legal, and lending stakeholders—rescheduling or canceling this previously coordinated meeting at this stage would impose significant logistical, financial, and operational burdens, including the potential inability to reconvene all required participants within a reasonable timeframe.

5. The AES meeting is of material importance to the continuity and reliability of generation resources, and its timely execution is essential to ongoing negotiations being conducted by PREPA under P3A oversight. At the same time, the Technical Conference convened by the Bureau is equally important and requires the meaningful participation of the same key stakeholders, including AES and PREPA.

6. Good cause exists to reschedule the Technical Conference. To that extent, the P3A suggests the conference be moved to the very next day, March 26, 2026, so as not to cause any undue delay. The current scheduling conflict is not the result of delay or lack of diligence, but rather the convergence of two important proceedings—one regulatory and one contractual—both of which are critical to system reliability and fuel supply stability. Granting this request will allow all parties to meaningfully participate in both proceedings without compromising the quality of the information provided to the Bureau or the progress of critical system negotiations.

7. Under these circumstances, granting the requested continuance will facilitate full and effective participation in both proceedings, without prejudice to any party and without compromising the quality, completeness, or integrity of the information presented to the Bureau.

WHEREFORE, in light of the foregoing, P3A respectfully requests that the Puerto Rico Energy Bureau 1) reschedule the Technical Conference currently set for March 25, 2026, to March 26, 2026, or to any such other date as the Bureau may

deem appropriate; and 2) grant any other relief that the Bureau deems just and proper under the circumstances.
