SUBJECT: Resolution and Order for Request
to Reschedule Virtual Technical Conference
of March 25, 2026.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On March 18, 2026, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") ordered LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (collectively, "LUMA"); Genera PR, LLC ("Genera") and the Electric Power Authority ("Authority") to a Virtual Technical Conference, to be held on **Wednesday, March 25, 2026 at 10:00 a.m.**, for the purpose of inquiring about the impact of the conflict in Iran and the exemption granted by President Donald J. Trump to the Jones Act in the fuel market and the cost to consumers. Shortly thereafter, the Energy Bureau also ordered AES and EcoEléctrica and invited APER to the aforementioned hearing, with the aim to evaluate said impact on the costs of energy purchase.

On March 22, 2026, the Puerto Rico Public-Private Partnerships Authority ("P3A") filed a document titled *Request for Rescheduling of Technical Conference* ("March 22 Request"), in which P3A explains that it had previously scheduled an in-person meeting between AES, the Puerto Rico Electric Authority ("PREPA") and P3A to take place on March 25, 2026, related to the extension of the Power Purchase and Operating Agreement ("PPOA"). Therefore, P3A requests the Energy Bureau to reschedule the Virtual Technical Conference currently set for March 25, 2026, to the following day, March 26, 2026.

The Energy Bureau **DENIES** P3A's request for rescheduling the Virtual Technical Conference set for March 25, 2026. As regulated parties, AES and PREPA can file their own motions and any rescheduling request.

The **virtual** conference will be held as scheduled due to the proximity of the implementation of the factors. **Attendance is required**, whether personally or through a representative. Any party unable to attend must justify its absence and such party shall submit its position in writing regarding the Iran conflict and the Jones Act exemption **on or before tomorrow Wednesday, March 25, 2026 at 5:00 p.m.**

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** that failure to comply with this Resolution and Order will result in the imposition of fines under Art. 6.36 of Act 57-2014.







