**MOTION TO REQUEST EXTENSION TO COMPLY WITH RESOLUTION AND  
ORDER OF MARCH 24, 2026**

**TO THE HONORABLE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:**

COME now LUMA Energy, LLC (“ManagementCo”), and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (“ServCo”), (jointly referred to as “LUMA”), and respectfully state and request the following:

1. On March 4, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order (“March 4<sup>th</sup> Order”) initiating the referenced proceeding for the review of the Three-Year Plan for Energy Efficiency and Demand Response (“TYP”) submitted by LUMA on March 2, 2026<sup>1</sup>, and setting forth a procedural calendar for such purposes. Specifically, the Energy Bureau scheduled a virtual Technical Workshop for March 17, 2026, for LUMA to present a summary of its proposed TYP and answer questions from the Energy Bureau and stakeholders; established the deadlines of April 7, 2026, for stakeholders to submit comments, and April 28, 2026, for the submittal of reply

comments; and a term for implementation of the TYP of July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2028. *See* March 4<sup>th</sup> Order, p. 2.

2. On March 16, 2026, LUMA submitted a presentation for the virtual Technical Workshop to be held on March 17, 2026<sup>2</sup>, and, on March 17, 2026, the virtual Technical Workshop was held.

3. On March 24, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order (“March 24<sup>th</sup> Order”) in which it ordered LUMA to submit, within fourteen (14) calendar days, that is by **April 7, 2026**: a response to Requirements of Information included in Attachment A of the March 24<sup>th</sup> Order (the “March 24<sup>th</sup> ROIs”); a proposal for performance incentive metrics and associated targets for the TYP, in accordance with Section 4.02(D)(6) of the Regulation 9367, Regulation for Energy Efficiency (“EE Regulation”); and a proposed plan to achieve the 2040 goal of 30% savings, in accordance with Section 4.02(B) of the EE Regulation.

4. The March 24<sup>th</sup> ROIs consist of thirty-two numbered items, some of which include more than one question or request, for a total of roughly more than fifty items to address. The responses for these multiple requirements of information are due within the same time period as the two additional requirements of the March 24<sup>th</sup> Order to submit the proposals on the performance incentive metrics and the achievement of 30% savings goal. Given this situation, LUMA respectfully requests additional time to ensure that the information required by the Order—central to the Energy Bureau’s evaluation of the Three-Year Plan—is developed with the time

necessary to support a complete, methodologically sound submission appropriate for a filing of this scope.

5. In light of the above, LUMA is respectfully requesting an extension until April 20, 2026, to comply with the March 24<sup>th</sup> Order. LUMA also proposes that the April 28<sup>th</sup> deadline be made available for stakeholder comments. This change would also provide stakeholders, given that they may also be impacted by the interceding holidays, with additional time to engage in a meaningful review of the TYP, while also allowing them to take into consideration LUMA's April 20<sup>th</sup> filing in their comments. Furthermore, these proposed changes would not impact the overall schedule for implementation of the TYP.

6. It is respectfully informed that this request for extension is limited, made in good faith, and is not intended to cause unnecessary delay.

**WHEREFORE**, LUMA respectfully requests that the Energy Bureau **take notice** of the foregoing and grant LUMA's request to extend the deadline to comply with the March 24<sup>th</sup> Order until April 20, 2026, as further detailed in this motion.
