**MOTION REQUESTING AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO COMPLY WITH APRIL 1, 2026,  
RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

**TO THE PUERTO RICO ENERGY BUREAU:**

**COMES NOW** the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") through its undersigned legal representation and, very respectfully, informs and requests as follows:

1. On February 27, 2026, the Public Service Regulatory Board of the Puerto Rico Energy Bureau ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order related to the Initial Procedural Calendar for the 2025 Integrated Resource Plan proceeding ("2025 IRP"). The Resolution formally commenced the adjudicative phase of the case and set forth key deadlines and procedural directives, including the timeline for intervention and *amicus curiae* participation, as well as discovery. It also scheduled the Initial Technical Hearing for March 18, 2026, at 9:30 a.m.

2. On March 4, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order modifying the previously established procedural calendar by rescheduling the Initial Technical Hearing from March 18, 2026, to March 19, 2026, at 9:30 a.m. The

Energy Bureau further indicated that additional details regarding the hearing's hybrid format, applicable rules of conduct, and order of proceedings would be provided at a later date.

3. On March 13, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order ("March 13 Resolution") establishing the structure, format, duration, and schedule for the Initial Technical Hearing in the 2025 IRP proceeding. The March 13 Resolution provided that the hearing would be conducted in a hybrid format and detailed the agenda, including segmented presentations by LUMA Energy, LLC ("LUMA"), followed by questioning from the Energy Bureau and its consultants. It also clarified the limited role of stakeholders at that stage and emphasized that the purpose of the hearing was to allow LUMA to present its IRP methodology, modeling approach, and Preferred Resource Plan, while enabling the Energy Bureau to identify key issues for further examination in subsequent stages of the proceeding.

4. On April 1, 2026, following the Initial Technical Hearing, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order ("April 1 Resolution") directing the submission of additional information requests ("ROIs") arising from LUMA's presentation of its 2025 IRP. The April 1 Resolution included detailed ROIs to LUMA (*Attachment A*) regarding its modeling assumptions, outage representations, and analytical outputs, as well as ROIs related to potential new or converted generation resources under consideration. The Energy Bureau also ordered PREPA to provide LUMA, **within five (5) business days**, due tomorrow, April 9, 2026,

with any necessary information to enable LUMA to respond to its ROIs, included in *Attachment B* of the resolution, and further ordered LUMA to file its responses within ten (10) business days.

5. Since the issuance of the April 1 Resolution, PREPA has been diligently working to compile and gather the information necessary to comply with the Energy Bureau's directives. However, the five (5)-business-day period provided, coupled with the holiday period during the week of March 30 through April 3, 2026 (Holy Week), significantly limited PREPA's ability to timely collect and verify the requested information. Additionally, the information responsive to the ROIs must be obtained from third parties, including AES and the Puerto Rico Public-Private Partnerships Authority ("P3A").

6. PREPA has already coordinated with AES and P3A to obtain information responsive to the ROIs and is currently awaiting their responses.

7. Considering the foregoing, PREPA respectfully requests a brief extension until April 17, 2026, to submit the responses to the ROIs.

8. This request is made in good faith and will not unduly delay the proceedings. On the contrary, it will enable PREPA to provide the Energy Bureau with accurate, complete, and reliable information, and ensure that LUMA can fully and properly rely on such information in responding to the ROIs, as required by the April 1 Resolution.

**WHEREFORE**, PREPA respectfully requests that the Energy Bureau take notice of the foregoing, and **GRANT** it until April 17, 2026, to submit the responses to the

requests of information in its April 1 Resolution.
