**RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

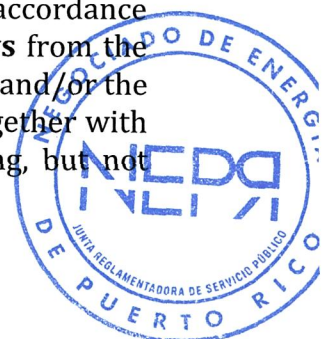
On March 19, 2025, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order addressing the challenges posed by the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") aging thermal generation fleet ("March 19 Resolution"). The Energy Bureau noted that frequent forced outages have significantly reduced available generation capacity, complicating essential maintenance and repairs. To ensure reliability and meet Puerto Rico's energy policy goals, the Energy Bureau determined that there was an urgent need to evaluate the costs and timelines for deploying modern generation sources that serve the best interests of electricity customers.

Also, in the March 19 Resolution directed PREPA to notify the Puerto Rico Public-Private Partnership Authority ("P3 Authority") to initiate a Request for Proposal ("RFP") for new generation sources. This procurement effort should explore between 2,500 and 3,000 MW of new capacity, preferably in units not exceeding 400 MW each. The Energy Bureau emphasized that these units must offer flexibility to integrate renewable energy and support the island target of achieving 100% renewable generation by 2050. Furthermore, the RFP should not be limited to gas-fired plants but should include all types of generation that qualify as baseload under current public policy. To optimize efficiency, the Energy Bureau recommended locating new units as close as possible to major load centers.

On October 17, 2025, the P3 Authority initiated the competitive procurement process for the New Flexible Generation Capacity project by issuing the Request for Qualifications, RFQ 2025-02 ("RFQ"), thereby commencing the qualifications phase for potential proponents.

In accordance with the foregoing, PREPA is **ORDERED** to provide the Energy Bureau, within **ten (10) days** from the notification of this Resolution and Order, all documents related to or generated in connection with the RFQ previously submitted into the record in connection with the procurement of approximately 3,000 MW of new generation capacity, including, but not limited to, all attachments, appendices, exhibits, addenda, amendments, notices, communications, correspondence, questions and answers, clarifications, comments, bidder submissions, supporting documentation, evaluation materials, scoring materials, qualification determinations, lists of qualified or selected proponents, recommendations, draft contracts, and any other materials forming part of, submitted in connection with, or otherwise associated with such RFQ process. Additionally, a copy of the RFP issued in connection with such procurement process, together with all documents related thereto or generated in connection therewith, including, but not limited to, all attachments, appendices, exhibits, addenda, amendments, notices, communications, correspondence, questions and answers, clarifications, comments, bidder submissions, proposals, supporting documentation submitted as part of any proposal, evaluation materials, draft contracts, and any other materials forming part of, submitted in connection with, or otherwise associated with such RFP process.

Furthermore, it has been publicly reported through government officials regarding a public bidding process is underway to develop a new firm generation facility at the PREPA Costa Sur power plant complex to provide additional capacity to the electric system. In accordance with this process, PREPA is hereby **ORDERED** to provide, within **ten (10) days** from the notification of this Resolution and Order, a copy of the Request for Qualifications and/or the Request for Proposals, issued in connection with such procurement process, together with all documents related thereto or generated in connection therewith, including, but not



limited to, all attachments, appendices, exhibits, addenda, amendments, notices, communications, correspondence, questions and answers, clarifications, comments, bidder submissions, proposals, supporting documentation submitted as part of any proposal, evaluation materials, draft contracts, and any other materials forming part of, submitted in connection with, or otherwise associated with such RFP process.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** PREPA that, in accordance Art. 6.36 of Act 57-2014:

- (i) noncompliance with this Resolution and Order, regulations and/or applicable laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions of up to \$125,000 per day; and
- (ii) for any recurrence of non-compliance or violation, the established penalty shall increase to a fine of not less than ten thousand dollars (\$15,000) nor greater than twenty thousand dollars (\$250,000), at the discretion of the Energy Bureau.




