**SUBJECT:** Resolution and Order regarding *Motion Submitting Compiled Financial Statements for FY 2025; Motion to File Under Seal to Protect Confidential Information; and Motion in Response to Order to Show Cause and in Compliance with Operational Report Requirement*, filed by Green Power Technologies Puerto Rico, LLC.

**RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

**I. Introduction**

On March 30, 2026, Green Power Technologies Puerto Rico, LLC. ("Green Power") filed before the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") a *Gross Revenue Report* (Form NEPR-B05) for FY 2025.

On April 23, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order ("April 23 Resolution") granting Green Power ten (10) days to show cause as to why the Energy Bureau should not impose an administrative fine of \$10,000 pursuant to Article 6.36 of Act 57-2014<sup>1</sup> for failure to comply with the Energy Bureau's regulatory requirements to file an annual operational report as required by Section 2.02 of Regulation 8701<sup>2</sup>. The April 23 Resolution also granted Green Power ten (10) days to file its *Operational Report Electric Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B03).

On April 30, 2026, Green Power filed a document titled *Motion Submitting Compiled Financial Statements for FY 2025* ("April 30 Motion") including its compiled Financial Statements for FY 2025. On the same date, Green Power filed a document titled *Motion to File Under Seal to Protect Confidential Information Pursuant to Section 1.15 of Regulation 8701 and Section 6.15 of Act 57-2014* ("Second April 30 Motion") requesting confidential treatment and designation of the Financial Statements included in the April 30 Motion.

Green Power submitted a redacted version of the April 30 Motion in compliance with: (i) Section 6.15 of Act 57-2014; (ii) Section 1.15 of Regulation 8701; and (iii) *In Re: Policy on Management of Confidential Information in Procedures before the Commission*, Case No.: CEPR-MI-2016-0009, Resolution and Order issued on August 31, 2016 ("Confidential Treatment Resolution").

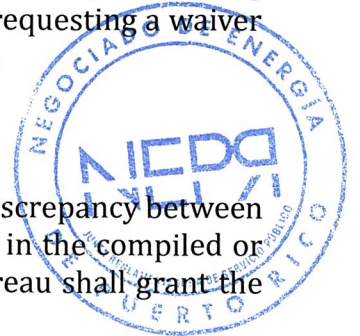
On May 4, 2026, Green Power filed a document titled *Motion in Response to Order to Show Cause and in Compliance with Operational Report Requirement* ("May 4 Motion") submitting its *Operational Report Electric Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B03) and requesting a waiver of the corresponding filing fee under Section 2.03(B) of Regulation 8701.

**II. Applicable Laws and Regulations**

Section 4.02(H) of Regulation 8701 states that in cases where there is a discrepancy between the information provided in the gross income report and that provided in the compiled or audited financial statements, whatever the case may be, the Energy Bureau shall grant the

electric service company the opportunity to explain said discrepancy and it may require whichever additional information it deems necessary.

Section 2.03(B) of Regulation 8701 that companies can request to be waived of payment of filing fees for the submission of the operational report when such payment would be onerous.

### III. Conclusion


The Energy Bureau **GRANTS** confidential designation and treatment to Green Power's Financial Statements.

In accordance with Section 4.02(H) of Regulation 8701, the Energy Bureau **GRANTS** Green Power **ten (10) days**, from the notification of this Resolution and Order, to explain the discrepancy of \$49,423.10 between the information provided in the gross income report submitted on March 30, 2026 and the gross revenue included in the financial statements submitted through the April 30 Motion.


The Energy Bureau **TAKES NOTICE** of the filing of the *Operational Report Electric Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B03) and **WAIVES** Green Power from the corresponding filing fee, as requested.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** Green Power that failure to comply with this Resolution and Order will result in the imposition of fines in accordance with Section 6.36 of Act 57-2014.


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


