SUBJECT: Resolution and Order regarding
Response to Show Cause filed by Horizon
Energy, LLC.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On March 20, 2026, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued an *Order to Show Cause* ("March 20 Order") granting HORIZON ENERGY, LLC. ("Horizon") ten (10) days to show cause as to why the Energy Bureau should not impose an administrative fine of \$10,000 pursuant to Article 6.36 of Act 57-2014¹ for failure to comply with the Energy Bureau's regulatory requirements, for not submitting its annual gross revenue, as required by Section 4.02 of Regulation 8701.²

On March 26, 2026, Horizon filed a document titled *Response to Show Cause* ("March 26 Motion") submitting: (i) *Operational Report Electric Power Companies* (Form NEPR-B03), (ii) Gross Revenue Report (Form NEPR-B05), (iii) *Complementary Sheet* (Form NEPR-Z01) with additional information for Form NEPR-B03; and (iv) certain unaudited financial statements for FY 2025. Horizon requested until the end of May 2026 to submit the final approved FY 2025 audited financial statements.

Section 2.02(A) of Regulation 8701 describes the information that must be included in the operational reports of electric power companies. Section 2.02(A)(1)(c) of Regulation 8701 requires the following information, among other, from electric power companies with an aggregate capacity equal to or less than one hundred megawatts (100 MW):

A projection of the capital investments it will make within a one (1) year time horizon, including investments for the acquisition or use of equipment, technologies, systems, and facilities.

The Energy Bureau **GRANTS** Horizon **until May 31, 2026**, to submit its FY 2025 audited financial statements, as requested and to submit the amount for the capital investments reported in its operational report.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** Horizon that failure to comply with this Resolution and Order will result in the imposition of fines in accordance with Section 6.36 of Act 57-2014.


