**SUBJECT: Request for Extension of Time to
Submit Joint Reconciliation Plan
Amendment in Compliance with Final Rate
Order**

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

I. Introduction

On April 15, 2026, the Puerto Rico Energy Bureau (the "Energy Bureau"), acting pursuant to its authority under Act 57-2014,¹ issued the Final Resolution and Order on Electricity Rates in *In re: Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority Rate Review*, Case No. NEPR-AP-2023-0003 (the "Rate Order").² Among the determinations issued in the Rate Order, the Energy Bureau directed LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (jointly, "LUMA") to file, no later than May 15, 2026, a joint plan—agreed on by LUMA, Genera PR, LLC ("Genera"), and the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA")—describing the use, during Fiscal Year 2027 ("FY27"), of the Fiscal Year 2026 ("FY26") reconciliation amount of \$98,641,949, in the form of an amendment to the FY27 Budget (the "Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment").³

On May 15, 2026, LUMA filed in *In re: Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority Rate Review*, Case No. NEPR-AP-2023-0003 a document titled *LUMA's Request for Extension of Time to Submit Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment in Compliance with Final Rate Order* (the "May 15 Motion"). In the May 15 Motion, LUMA requests a brief extension of time, until May 20, 2026, within which to file the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment, and represents that Genera joins in the request and likewise seeks an extension to that same date.⁴ By this Resolution and Order, the Energy Bureau (i) **GRANTS** the requested extension and (ii) **DIRECTS** LUMA to file the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment, and any subsequent filings concerning that amendment, in *In Re: LUMA Initial Budgets and Related Terms of Service*, Case No. NEPR-MI-2021-0004.

II. Discussion

In support of the May 15 Motion, LUMA represents that the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment requires extensive validation of project-level data; that LUMA is currently finishing validation and reconciliation of the data to be included in the plan; and that the brief, five-day extension to May 20, 2026, will allow LUMA to complete the submission.⁵ LUMA further represents that Genera is seeking the same brief extension and that no harm will result to any of the three utilities from the extensions sought.⁶ LUMA states that the request is made in good faith and is not intended to cause unnecessary delay, and reaffirms its commitment to complying with the orders issued by the Energy Bureau.⁷ The Energy Bureau finds the showing reasonable and well supported.

Although LUMA filed the Motion in Case No. NEPR-AP-2023-0003, the proceeding in which the Energy Bureau issued the Rate Order, the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment is, by its terms, an amendment to the FY27 Budget.⁸ Matters relating to LUMA's initial budgets and related terms of service, including budget amendments, are administered in this docket *In Re: LUMA Initial Budgets and Related Terms of Service*, Case No. NEPR-MI-2021-0004. To preserve the integrity of the budget record and to ensure that the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment, the subsequent review thereof, and any related orders remain consolidated with the underlying budgets to which the amendment pertains, the Energy Bureau **DIRECTS** LUMA, Genera, and PREPA to file the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment, and any subsequent pleadings, motions, or filings concerning that amendment, in this procedure *In Re: LUMA Initial Budgets and Related Terms of Service*, Case No. NEPR-MI-2021-0004.


III. Conclusion

The Energy Bureau **GRANTS** LUMA's Motion and **EXTENDS**, until **Wednesday, May 20, 2026**, for LUMA to file the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment required by the Rate Order.

The Energy Bureau **DIRECTS** LUMA to file the Joint Reconciliation Plan Amendment, and any subsequent pleadings, motions, or filings concerning that amendment, in this procedure *In Re: LUMA Initial Budgets and Related Terms of Service*, Case No. NEPR-MI-2021-0004.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** that in accordance with Article 6.36 of Act 57-2014 noncompliance with this Resolution and Order, applicable regulations, or laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions.




