**RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

**I. Introduction**

On April 15, 2026, the Energy Bureau of the Public Service Regulatory Board (“Energy Bureau”) issued the Final Resolution and Order on Electricity Rates, in *In re: Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority Rate Review* Case No. NEPR-AP-2023-0003, which established the approved rate structure applicable to electric service in Puerto Rico (“Rate Order”). Among the directives included in the Rate Order, the Energy Bureau ordered that:

“PREPA shall file scope delineation memoranda for all engagements exceeding \$200,000 within 60 days of this order, identifying the specific matters handled, the rates charged by attorney, and the basis for any rates exceeding \$400 per hour. Each memorandum shall demonstrate that the engagement does not duplicate legal functions performed by LUMA Energy or Genera PR...”

On June 16, 2026, PREPA<sup>1</sup> filed a document titled *Motion Requesting Extension of Time* (“June 16 Motion”) through which PREPA requested a 45-day extension to comply with the Energy Bureau’s order and file the required engagement scope memoranda.

PREPA stated that it recognizes the importance of the information requested by the Energy Bureau and remains committed to full compliance, but that operational and resource constraints have materially affected its ability to provide the requested information in the prescribed timeframe. PREPA relates that its legal service budgets are exhausted, and the attorneys in PREPA’s Legal Services Directorate have significantly increased workloads, including Energy Bureau regulatory obligations.

**II. Discussion**

The Energy Bureau finds that PREPA’s explanation of its staffing and budgetary constraints establishes good cause to grant the requested extension.

**III. Conclusion**

The Energy Bureau **APPROVES** PREPA’s request. PREPA is granted a forty-five (45)-day extension from the original due date to file the engagement scope memoranda required by the Rate Order.


