**RESOLUTION AND ORDER**

**I. Relevant Background**

On May 28, 2019, the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board ("Energy Bureau") issued a Resolution and Order ("May 28 Order") approving the Spanish and English versions of the Tariff Book submitted by the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority ("PREPA") in the matter of *In Re: Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority Rate Review*, Case No. CEPR-AP-2015-0001.<sup>1</sup>

On April 15, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Final Resolution and Order on Electricity Rates ("Final Rate Order") in the matter of *In Re: Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority Rate Review*, Case No. NEPR-AP-2023-0003.<sup>2</sup> Among the decisions issued in the Final Rate Order, the Energy Bureau determined to amend the rate structure for revenue allocation on different rate classes. Consequently, the Tariff Book must be revised to reflect the approved rates and to eliminate any rates that are no longer valid or in effect.

On May 22, 2026, LUMA Energy, LLC ("ManagementCo") and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC ("ServCo") (collectively, "LUMA") filed a document titled *Urgent Request for Clarification Regarding New CATV Rates* ("May 22 Motion"), in which LUMA requested clarification from the Energy Bureau regarding the Cable TV Power Supplies (CATV) tariff established in the Final Rate Order.

On June 4, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a Resolution and Order ("June 4 Order") clarifying the CATV rates; therefore, resolving the discrepancies and adopting rates aligned with the approved revenue allocation.

On June 30, 2026, LUMA filed a document titled *LUMA's Motion to Submit Revised Tariff Book* ("June 30 Motion"), in which LUMA submits, as Exhibit 1, a revised Tariff Book in both Spanish and English for the Energy Bureau to TAKE NOTICE of such filing. LUMA indicates that the revised Tariff Book reflects the rates, riders and charges approved by the Energy Bureau in the Final Rate Order.

**II. Discussion and Conclusion**

The Final Rate Order adjusted the revenue allocation for the Lifeline Residential Service (LRS) and Residential Service for Public Housing Projects (RH3) riders by determining that the applicable low-income discount shall be recovered through base rates rather than through the Help-to-Humans subsidies (SUBA-HH) rider.<sup>3</sup> In addition, the provisional rate was reconciled with the approved rates and incorporated into the FY-2027 revenue requirement<sup>4</sup>, while the pension rider is now integrated into the base rate, thereby eliminating the need for the pension rider.<sup>5</sup>

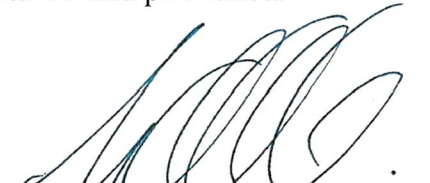


LUMA states that the revisions in the Tariff Book include, among other changes: i) amendments to the SUBA-HH rider to align with the Energy Bureau’s determination that the Lifeline Residential Service (LRS) and Residential Service for Public Housing Projects discounts are to be recovered through base rates rather than through the rider; (ii) elimination of the Provisional Rider and Pension Payments Rider, consistent with the incorporation of such costs into the approved FY2027 revenue requirement and base rates; (iii) updates to the Net Metering Credit and related provisions to ensure consistency with the revised charges; and (iv) revisions to the Cable TV Power Supplies (CATV) tariff to reflect the Energy Bureau’s June 4 Order.

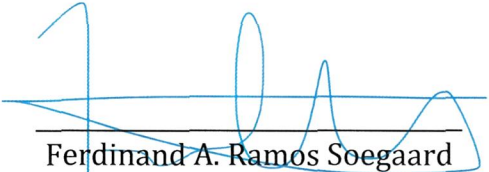
Upon review, the Energy Bureau **DETERMINES** that the revised Tariff Book reflects the current approved rate structure established in the Final Rate Order. Therefore, the Energy Bureau **TAKES NOTICE** and **APPROVES** the Spanish and English versions of the amended Tariff Book. LUMA is **ORDERED** to, withing ten (10) days of this Resolution and Order, publish both versions of the Tariff Book on its web page.

The Energy Bureau **WARNS** that under Article 6.36 of Act 57-2014<sup>6</sup> noncompliance with this Resolution and Order, applicable regulations, or laws may carry the imposition of fines and administrative sanctions.
