SUBJECT: Order Directing Genera to Provide
Notice of Filing Concerning the Annual
Performance Test Procedure

RESOLUTION AND ORDER

On March 13, 2026, Genera PR LLC (“Genera”) filed with the Energy Bureau of the Puerto Rico Public Service Regulatory Board (“Energy Bureau”) its Equivalent Availability Factor (“EAF”) targets for FY2025 and FY2026, with its Annual Performance Test Procedure (“APT”) results as Exhibit A and its EAF, capacity, and heat rate calculations as Exhibit B.¹

On July 22, 2026, Genera submitted a revised version of the APT (the “Revised APT”) and requested confidential treatment.² On July 31, 2026, Genera filed a memorandum in support of its request for confidential treatment of the Revised APT.³

On August 19, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a *Resolution and Order* (“August 19 Order”) through which directed Genera to respond to the Requirements of Information in Attachment A within fifteen (15) days of notification.

On August 26, 2026, the Energy Bureau issued a *Resolution and Order* (“August 26 Order”) through which authorizes its staff and consultants to hold informal technical meetings with Genera’s representatives to clarify the information and submission requirements in the August 19 Order and address questions about the Revised APT. The Energy Bureau clarified that any statements made by its staff or consultants during those meetings would be preliminary and nonbinding, and that only a written Resolution and Order issued by the Energy Bureau would constitute an official determination.

On September 2, 2026, representatives of Genera, LUMA Energy, LLC and LUMA Energy ServCo, LLC (collectively, “LUMA”), and the Puerto Rico Public-Private Partnership Authority (“P3A”) met with the Energy Bureau’s staff and consultants for an informal technical session (“Technical Session”). During the Technical Session, LUMA’s representatives stated that LUMA had received neither the Revised APT, which was filed under seal, nor the APT results.

On September 3, 2026, Genera filed its responses to the August 19 Order and requested confidential treatment of Exhibit 3, which includes the final APT reports not included in the March 2026 Motion.⁴

Given LUMA’s statement during the Technical Session, the Energy Bureau **ORDERS** Genera to serve LUMA with the March 2026 Motion, the July 22 Motion, the September 3 Motion, and any other filings and documents regarding the APT within **five (5) days** of notification of this Resolution and Order. The Energy Bureau further **ORDERS** LUMA to file its comments on the Revised APT within **twenty (20) days** of receiving those documents from Genera. In addition, LUMA is hereby ordered to provide, within the same twenty (20)-day period, its responses to the Requests for Information included in Attachment A to this Resolution and Order. To the extent that LUMA does not have access to any of the documents referenced in Attachment A,

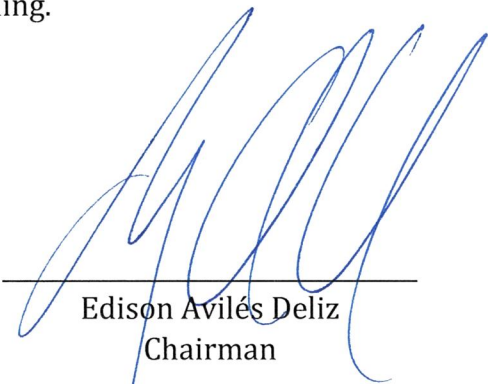

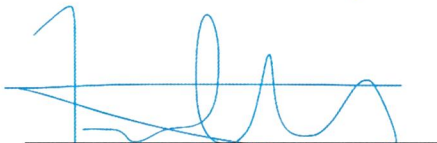


LUMA shall request such documents from Genera, and Genera shall produce them to LUMA within five (5) days of LUMA’s request.

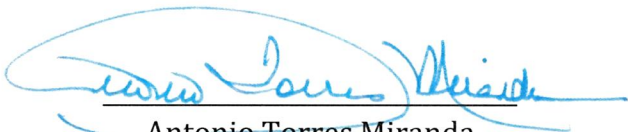
The Energy Bureau further **DIRECTS** that LUMA be served with all documents subsequently filed or issued in this proceeding.
